

Graduation Requirements (students entering 9th grade 2009-2010)

Below are the minimum requirements for high school graduation.

Mathematics Credits must include: Alg. I, Geometry, Alg. II, & one other upper level math course. Students must be enrolled in a math class each year of high school.	4 credits
Science (A lab science, Biology, and Chemistry or Physics)	3 credits
Social Studies 1 credit of World Geography, World History, AP Human Geography, or AP World History 1 credit of American History or AP American History ½ credit of Economics or Business Economics, or 1 credit of Marketing Education I ½ credit of U.S. Government, AP US Government or American Bus. Legal Systems	3 credits
Wellness* (½ credit of Health AND ½ credit of either PE or Physical Training)	1 credit
Physical Activity* (½ credit of either PE, Physical Training, S1 of Band, or Band Aux.)	½ credit

Foreign Language** (Levels I and II of the same language)	2 credits
Fine Arts**	1 credit
Keyboarding & CMS	1 credit
Program of Study (3 credits must be attained from the same program of study)	3 credits

* Two (2) credits of JROTC replace 1 credit of Wellness requirement
ALSO Three (3) credits of JROTC replace ½ credit for Physical Activity and ½ credit of Personal Finance

**Students who are NOT planning to attend college may replace the Foreign Language and Fine Art requirements with 3 additional credits that either expand the selected Program of Study or complete an additional Program of Study.

SENIOR TOP TEN PERCENT: To qualify for the Top 10% of the senior class, students must have passed at least one (1) honors course and at least one (1) AP course.

TESTING REQUIREMENT: The PLAN is required to be taken in the fall of the sophomore year. The ACT is required to be taken during the junior year. End-of-Course tests are given in English I, English II, Algebra I, Biology, & US History which count as 20% of the yearly average in 2010 (after 2010 the percentage goes to 25% of the yearly average). The State of Tennessee has plans to implement Algebra II, English III, Chemistry, & Physics in the near future.

Three credits must be attained in an Academic or CTE Program of Study. These three credits complete the 23 required credits needed for graduation.

The student must complete 3 credits in ONE Program of study. If no Program of Study has been completed, the student will not be allowed to receive a high school diploma in Tennessee.

CTE Programs of Study

NOTE: If a CTE Program of Study is selected, a minimum of 3 credits must be earned in the same program for graduation.

The (3) required foreign language and fine art credits may NOT be used in either the Humanities or the Fine Art Programs of Study.

JROTC I & II replace the Wellness requirement. JROTC III replaces the Physical Activity & Personal Finance requirements.

A full credit of Marketing Ed I replaces the required 1/2 credit of Economics.
